A guide on qualitative research methodologies is intended as a tool for study, as well as a hands-on guide for researchers and students who need to know which research practices are relevant to their preferred study.


Based on a practical definition of the qualitative research, this book suggests six meta-methodologies encompassing all the methodological types of qualitative research.
